School Readiness Programs/Resources in RI Libraries

- Providence Public Library
 - o Family Literacy Bags http://www.provlib.org/family-literacy-bags
 - Created in partnership with RIDE and a Race to the Top grant
 - Based on the 9 learning domains outlined in the RI Early Learning Standards
 - 27 bags one for each age group in each of the 9 learning domains
 - Designed for parents
 - Each kit contains the Fun Family Activity Cards, 3-4 books for parents to share with their child, a book for the parent to use as a resource, and an activity
 - Books were vetted with RIDE for availability in English & Spanish
 - Encourages parents that what they're already doing helps with development

- No fines for late, damaged, or missing items. Patrons are only charged if the kit isn't returned

 - Thematic Learning and Reading Kits containing books, games, music, manipulatives, etc.
 - Spanish/English bilingual kids available
 - Geared for teachers and home child care providers

 - Gives out early lit tips on cut out crayons. Each cut out is hole punch and collected on a ring each week

 - o Ready for K! IMLS grant funded program
 - 9 consecutive weeks
 - Designed for parent/caregiver & child
 - Participants are expected to attend all 9 sessions and pre-reg
 - Intentionally run during "preschool time" to reach kids who weren't already in a prek program
 - Partnered with the school dept. to market program to families registering for kindergarten
 - The initial grant funded bilingual literacy aids at all sessions
 - It cost \$17,000 to purchase learning center materials for 9 locations (see Learning Center Materials handout)
 - This summer the program will take place in 5 school parking lots with the mobile library – public schools will share the literacy assessment of participating kids
- South Kingstown
 - o Preschool explorers see attached handout for more info
 - Run as pre-k science explorers, art explorers, etc.
 - Pre-reg. recommended, drop-ins welcome
 - o 1000 Books Before Kindergarten
 - Tracking is done on paper to encourage kids "tracking" their own reading by coloring/marking squares – sheets have tracking on one side early lit. tips on the other
 - Kids get small prizes for meeting goals and get a book at the end
 - Newport & Cumberland are looking to launch 1000 Books program Cumberland will use ReadSquared interface
